

Community Legal Centre Fellowship 2011

Have you been working or volunteering in the community legal sector for the past two years?

Do you have an idea for a project, but not enough time to get it started?

Consider applying for a Victoria Law Foundation Community Legal Centre Fellowship.

The Community Legal Centre (CLC) Fellowship allows a CLC worker to undertake a research project and travel within Australia or overseas.

The Fellowship is awarded annually, through a competitive application process to one CLC worker with suitable qualifications and experience.

About the Fellowship

Based on a sabbatical model, an award of \$30,000 to \$50,000 covers the cost of back-filling the Fellow's position for a period between three to six months, and the costs of undertaking the project.

Who can apply?

The Fellowship is open to CLC workers. Applicants must have at least two years continuous involvement in the CLC sector, as an employee or volunteer, at any time prior to the closing of the application period.
