There are many things to sort out. We are here to help you with your legal issues.

You may have questions about your rights. You can call the **Victorian bushfire legal help line on 1800 113 432** to get free legal information about:

- dealing with insurance companies – house, life and car
- what to do if you are uninsured, underinsured or denied a claim
- housing and tenancy
- your property – repairs, rebuilding and selling, removing debris and demolition, looting and trespass
- dealing with electricity, phone and water companies
- Wills
- money problems, paying your excess, mortgages and other debts
- getting your superannuation

- Centrelink benefits
- sticking to court orders
- child support payments
- your identification and documents
- contracts and small business issues
- contacting the Coroner's office
- going back to work and leave entitlements
- victims of crime
- personal injury
- other issues.
